



CALL FOR A POLICY FELLOW IN INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION

SOLIDAR is looking for a new policy fellow in the International Cooperation pillar who could possibly join SOLIDAR team as of **mid-September 2016 for a period up to 7 months.**

This fellowship program is open to post-graduate candidates with extensive academic and research background that are looking for an experience in a dynamic and international working environment. The fellowship is a unique learning experience on the development of EU policies in Brussels and will give you the opportunity to deepen your knowledge and research methods to evaluate how the embedding of the 2030 Agenda into the EU development, trade and investment approaches could contribute to reduce inequalities and mobilizing domestic resources for sustainable development.

Key tasks:

In the framework of the “**Progressive Lab for Sustainable Development**” you will be in charge of following all the steps of the production of a compilation of academic papers that will feed into key policy processes that will be undertaken by the European Institutions during the course of 2016 and 2017: **the Review of the EU consensus for Development, the Mid-term review of the Multi-Annual Financial framework (MFF), the revision of the EU-ACP partnership agreement, the adoption of an EU overarching strategy to implement 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.**

During the fellowship period, you will be directly responsible for:

- Liaising with the Progressive Lab for Sustainable Advisory Group for the selection of the abstracts and of the full papers
- Editing the selected papers and compile the full publication
- Coordinating the organization of the Symposium for peer review at the European Parliament in Brussels
- Preparing the organisation of the Progressive Lab for Sustainable development book launch

Key skills and competences:

- High-level University Degree (post-graduate/PhD level is an asset) with tangible academic research experience
- English mother tongue and fluency in French language
- Proven familiarity with the following topics: economic development models, decent work and social protection, education, tax justice and fair trade, human development.
